In-person or virtual presenters will have 13 minutes for paper presentation, and then 2 minutes for Q&A.

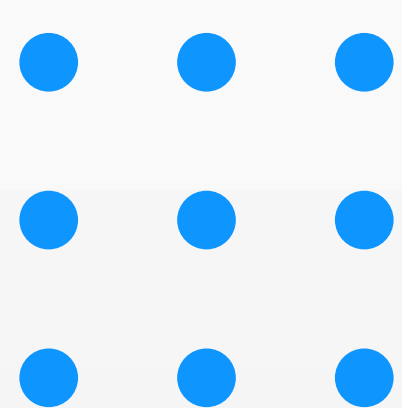
